



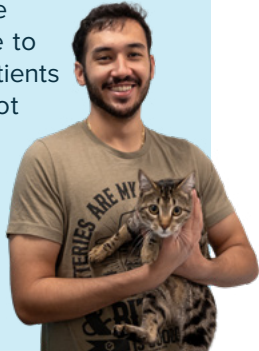

We center the medical needs of our patients while respecting and being guided by the values, preferences, and circumstances of their families (owners).

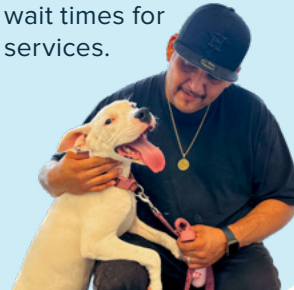
Efficient

Dear Friends,

2025 marked a pivotal year for Emancipet—one defined by momentum, innovation, and growing confidence in what is possible when accessible, high-quality veterinary care is treated as essential to healthy communities. It was also a pivotal year for me. In my first year as CEO, I have come to feel a profound sense of responsibility and gratitude for the trust placed in me to steward this mission. I am energized by the progress we are making together, inspired daily by the people behind this work, and hopeful about the opportunity ahead as Emancipet continues to grow its impact.

Over the last year, Emancipet has strengthened access to care across every region we serve. We engaged clients, staff, donors, and community partners across Central Texas, Houston, and Philadelphia, ensuring community insight actively informs our work. We expanded how families connect to and access care by launching Healthy Pet Services appointments, enhancing online booking for spay/neuter and preventive care, and introducing our Central Texas Regional Low-Cost Mobile Spay/Neuter Clinic to reach families beyond our urban service areas.

Our impact is increasingly visible across the regions we serve. In 2025, Austin proclaimed November 8 as Emancipet Day, while in Houston we doubled access to lifesaving heartworm treatment and launched a new partnership with the City, including plans for a large-scale vaccine clinic coming up in April. We also expanded community engagement through new volunteer opportunities and our Board of Friends, and launched a multi-year campaign to strengthen financial sustainability, ensuring long-term impact of our mission.

Together, this work enabled Emancipet to serve more than 275,000 pet visits across our 11 clinics in 2025—an impact powered by you, and by tens of thousands of clients, donors, and supporters who choose to Pay It Forward, keeping care affordable while expanding access for pet families tomorrow.

Looking ahead, our 2026–2028 strategic plan builds on this momentum. We are focused on expanding access in high-need communities, deepening public and private partnerships, investing in our people and systems, and strengthening the financial foundation that allows our mission to scale. Emancipet is well positioned to meet rising demand while maintaining the affordability, quality, and trust that define our work.

Thank you for being part of Emancipet's impact and future. Together, we are making veterinary care affordable and accessible for families across the lifetime of their beloved pets.

Outstanding Success in Spay/Neuter Safety



In 2025, Emancipet demonstrated that veterinary care can be both high-volume and exceptionally safe—essential to our commitment to affordable, high-quality care. Across another record-breaking year of upwards of 59,000 spay/neuter surgeries performed, our teams achieved extraordinary results in minimizing complications, further solidifying Emancipet’s commitment to excellence.

Complication Rates Below Target

Major complications involve intensive treatment or, in rare cases, the loss of a patient. These remained below our 0.3% goal at just 0.24%, even with roughly 5,000 more surgeries performed by our veterinarians than the prior year, and with several new doctors receiving high-volume surgery training during this time.

Minor complications—such as post-anesthesia upset stomachs or skin irritations—occurred at a rate of 3.1%. Many of these occurrences were unrelated to surgical performance and continued to trend downward throughout the year, reflecting targeted quality improvement efforts and additional surgical training for experienced doctors. The most common minor complications were gastrointestinal symptoms or mild incision-site inflammation, informing ongoing refinements to post-operative care and information shared with our clients.

Beyond routine procedures, Emancipet doctors performed nearly 450 emergency spay surgeries to treat life-threatening conditions such as pyometra and dystocia—underscoring our role as a trusted safety net for pets and families.

Through disciplined, data-driven care, Emancipet continues to deliver safe surgical outcomes at a scale that expands access for the most vulnerable communities. This year’s remarkable results are a testament to the exceptional dedication and skill of our veterinary surgical teams. Here’s to another year of saving lives and keeping pets healthy!



Mishka ended the year as one of Emancipet's nearly 59,000 spay and neuter patients of 2025!

Every year, we strive to raise the bar, and 2025 was no exception. We finished the year with 59,000 spay and neuter surgeries, beating last year's record by 5,000! Patients like Mishka, along with their families like Cristina, are what made this past year life-saving and record-breaking.

Cristina found herself in a position that no pet parent wants to be in. Her American Bully Mishka became ill overnight and was diagnosed with Pyometra, a life threatening infection of the uterus, the next morning. The quotes that she was receiving for Mishka to undergo emergency surgery were costly. She began looking for a place where she wouldn't have to worry about cost so that she could focus on Mishka's healing journey.

That search led her to Emancipet's Roosevelt Clinic in Philadelphia. "I saw Emancipet while searching online for resources, called them and explained the urgent situation," said Cristina. "They fit me in, SAME DAY (unheard of) with the most unbelievably charitable price possible. Finding Emancipet was truly a miracle beyond comprehension."

Since the surgery, Cristina has gone from fearing the worst to seeing Mishka recover and thrive day after day. "I'm still in disbelief. Dr. Lopez was phenomenal," she shared. "The team was amazing. They worked with me to save her life, I am forever grateful."

Mishka's story mirrors the many pet families who come through our doors seeking affordable, trusted care to help them stay together and stay healthy. And like so many families who place their trust in us, we're proud to have found a lifelong Emancipet supporter in Cristina.

Expanded Access to Heartworm Treatment in Houston: Bingo's Story.



Emancipet expanded access to our life-saving, low-cost heartworm treatment in Houston by adding services at our Monroe Clinic, in addition to those at our Wayside Clinic. Hear from Bingo's family about the impact of affordable heartworm treatment at Emancipet.
